

Pterodactyl-Mobile

When you complete this mobile, you will have a flock of the following Pterodactyls:

Quetzalcoatlus
Pterandon
Pterodaktylus
Dimorphodon
Ramphorynchus

What you need:


A printer (preferably color)
card stock
Glue
Thread
Two 1/8" dowels - 12" to 14" in length
Scissors

Instructions:




Take the two dowels and cross them, taping or tying them together. Attach a thread to each end of the crossed dowels. Tie a longer thread in the middle of the cross and let it hang down like the others. How long the threads are is up to you. They can be all the same length, or completely different. The middle thread should be the longest of all of them.

Print Pterodactyl-parts and cut them out. Leave a little white around each of the parts. Using a ruler, fold on the dotted lines between the body parts and the wing parts. You can hold up the folded paper against a lamp to see if the folded parts are flush with each other. Then paste together the folded surfaces against each other, and cut off the left over white around the parts. At the back on the bodies and the front of the wings are dashed lines. Cut into these with a pair of scissors. The notches fit into each other, and Pterodactyl is ready. Make a hole in the back, and attach one of the hanging threads through it. Quetzalcoatlus is the largest and is best hanging on the long thread in the center of the cross.




Tie a string on each tip of the crossed dowels, and lift them up. Tie these, and you have a suspension to your mobile.





Pterodaktylus




Dimorphodon




Ramphorynchus
